Submission Guidelines

Length

Articles should be not less than 350, 500 words, 750, 1000 or 1500 (maximum of 2000).

Plain English

While our Journal is aimed at professionals, this is also read by the public, and we aim to make the Journal as accessible as possible to the widest audience. So please consider your phraseology and terminology. If you feel there is a reference or industry term that may not be understood by many, please explain it alongside the mention and within the same paragraph, or as a last resort, add a footnote explanation. Format and proofing

Please supply your article as a Word or Pages document. Proof your article as much as you can, to reduce typos, errors of grammar or other mistakes. Sometimes asking a friend or colleague to read it can help. Our team will proof and edit your article before publishing on the Journal of Biophilic Design and we reserve the right to edit any copy if we feel it might read slightly better (which is good practice in all publishing houses), if we change it considerably, we will of course send it back to you for approval.

Subject matter

Our journal covers Biophilic Design and related topics, including, but not limited to: All patterns of biophilic design, interior design/architectural practices, town and city planning, sustainability in design, how design can support biodiversity, discussion on how to shape policy change to encourage nature-based solutions in civic and private environments, how biophilic design can support and improve healthcare, why biophilic design improves workplace environments, why nature is important to us as a species, evolutionary psychology, environmental psychology, why schools and education needs to include

If you have images you would like to use that are copyrighted, please obtain permission from the creator of the images prior to submission, thank you and let us know how they would like to be credited. We can source images if you don't have access to any so, please don't let this prevent you from submitting an article. Image format – please send images as 300 dpi jpgs, but if you struggle to resize or reformat, don't worry, please send the format you have, and we can reformat here. <u>We have a</u> <u>Dropbox for each issue, please upload using the link we send you if you can, that helps us and our designer.</u>

This should be your original work. Please read this on Plagiarism.

Please do not copy someone else's work. We reserve the right not to publish your article or to remove the article after publication should plagiarism be detected in it. This is of course usual practice, and we want to protect the reputation of our Journal and maintain our position as a trustworthy source of information and thought-leadership. If you would like to quote from a source, do so, but make sure you credit them. Please use the APA/Harvard style format when quoting your sources and references: name (date), *article/title of the book in italics*, name of publication if an article, page number(s) https://apastyle.apa.org/style-grammar-guidelines/references/basic-principles.
